Professor Kathryn von Truer
Chief Executive Officer & Provost

Professor von Truer commenced as Executive Director (now known as Chief Executive Officer) of the Institute in April 2016. She is a registered psychologist and an endorsed health and organisational psychologist, and sits on the Psychology Board of Australia. Her post graduate studies in psychology, together with her business qualifications, complement extensive industry experience in senior management across various sectors. Because of her commitment to the healthcare professions, psychological services, and education, she was invited to be an Honorary Associate Professor with the School of Medicine at Deakin University. Her research in education has been presented both nationally and internationally, and she is a significant contributor to the research undertaken by the Institute.



Professor Linda Byrne
Dean, Faculty of Psychology, Counselling and Psychotherapy

Prof Byrne joined Cairnmillar in 2023 after 18 years at Deakin University, with the last 7 in senior leadership roles. She is registered psychologist with an area of endorsement in Clinical Neuropsychology and has over 25 years of clinical, research and teaching experience in the areas of psychological assessment, neuropsychiatric disorders, neuropsychological disorders, and neuropsychological rehabilitation. Prof Byrne has extensive experience in training and supervising post-graduate psychology students. She has coordinated post-graduate training programs for many years. Prof Byrne's clinical work focuses on the neuropsychological assessment of children, adolescents, and adults with neurological, psychiatric, and educational difficulties. Her major area of research is in the understanding and remediation of neuro- and social cognitive deficits in clinical disorders. More recently Prof Byrne's research has been focusing on agents that may protect or improve cognitive functioning in both healthy and compromised populations.



Emeritus Professor John Catford

John Catford has specialist medical qualifications in paediatrics and public health. He has been a Professor of Public Health for over thirty years and has held senior academic and health service management positions in Australia and the UK, and with the World Health Organisation. He is a former Chief Health/Medical Officer, and he led the establishment of the Deakin Medical School that opened in Geelong in 2002. Professor Catford has been the Chair of Boards including the Postgraduate Medical Council of Victoria; VicHealth/Victorian Health Promotion Foundation and the Youth Support and Advocacy Service (YSAS) which includes FebFast.

Calling in Grief: Effectiveness and Moderators of a Telehealth Grief Counselling Program in an Australian Community-Based Organisation

This thesis evaluated the effectiveness of the Integrating Grief Program - Victoria (IGP-V), a brief, community-based telehealth service delivered by Griefline supporting Victorian adults through police-attended deaths. Recognising that grief is a highly individual and non-linear experience, the research examined overall outcomes, moderators of change, and session-level mechanisms influencing adaptation across three studies. Findings demonstrated significant reductions in psychological distress, grief symptoms, and trauma-related responses, alongside improvements in functioning and integration of loss. Benefits were strongest for individuals presenting with moderate initial distress, as well as those with supportive relational and contextual resources. A time-lagged analysis further identified key therapeutic processes, including meaning-focused dialogue, facilitating cognitive and behavioural coping, and emotional expression, as predictors of next-session improvement. Collectively, this research supports brief telephone-delivered grief counselling as an effective and scalable early intervention, with real-world implications for improving access to care, informing tailored clinical decision-making, and strengthening stepped-care responses for bereaved individuals within community settings.

Alexander Nicholas Matotek

Exploring Culturally and Racially Marginalised Australian Individuals' Experiences of Racism within Romantic Contexts

This thesis investigated racism in Australian romantic contexts among culturally and racially marginalised (CARM) individuals. The first study explored how experiences of racism in these contexts shape partner selection and influence dating attitudes, beliefs, and behaviours. From this work, the novel construct of Interpersonal Racial and Cultural Safety (IRCS) was developed to describe the degree to which CARM individuals feel racially and culturally safe within a romantic dyad. The project shifted toward developing and validating a measure of IRCS. The second study examined CARM individuals' perceptions of IRCS and reviewed proposed scale items, with a literature search finding no existing IRCS-like measures. In study three, the IRCS scale was validated through exploratory and confirmatory factor analyses using samples from both Australia and the United States of America. Overall, these studies provided preliminary evidence for the novel IRCS concept and suggest that it is a key consideration for CARM people when selecting romantic partners. It may assist in understanding variation in interpersonal interactions for CARM people in relationships, and why some CARM individuals may perceive such interactions as racist while others do not. The IRCS scale may be used by clinicians to gather information about the racial and cultural dynamics of the romantic relationships of CARM clients.
